
Sign in to your business's Google Account

You can create and manage your YouTube channel from the YouTube desktop site, mobile site, and YouTube app. There are some differences between how to access features across the three platforms – we'll mention which platform we recommend for each step.

To sign in to YouTube, you'll need to create a <u>Google Account</u>. If you already have a Google Account, enter your Gmail username to sign in. If you have a business account on Google, we recommend using it to get started. If you're using a personal account, see the next step on how to create a channel with your business name.

Once you create a channel, you'll be able to manage it from YouTube Studio.

Use your Google Account to sign in to YouTube on a <u>computer</u> or <u>phone</u> to create your channel.








Create your channel

There are two types of YouTube channels. You can create a <u>personal channel</u> that only you can manage using your Google Account or you can create a <u>Brand Account</u> that can have more than one manager or owner. If you're creating your first YouTube channel, we recommend using the YouTube desktop site.

- Sign in to YouTube on the desktop or the mobile site.
- Visit your <u>Channel list</u>.
- Choose to create a new channel or use an existing Brand Account.
- Create a channel by selecting **Create a new channel**.
- Fill out the details to name your new channel, then select **Create**.

Select your profile picture in the top right, then select **Create a channel**.







Personalize your channel

- From the YouTube desktop site, select Your channel in the top right. Then select Customize channel.
- Under Basic info, you can provide a brief description of your channel and change your channel name. You can find these options on the YouTube app by selecting Your channel, then Edit channel.
- On desktop, you can <u>add links</u> to your YouTube channel that direct viewers to your business's website and social media pages, so they can interact with you.
- You can also customize your channel URL and add contact information.

On the YouTube app, you can change **Basic info** like channel name and description by selecting **Your channel**, then **Edit channel**.








Brand your channel

You can find more detailed customization options within the **Layout** and **Branding** pages on the desktop site.

- From the YouTube desktop site, select Your channel in the top right. Then select Customize channel.
- Under the **Layout** heading, you can add a <u>channel trailer</u>. This is a preview of your channel shown to people who haven't subscribed yet. You can also <u>feature a video</u> for returning viewers.
- In the Branding section, you can upload or change your <u>profile</u>
 <u>picture</u> and add a <u>banner image</u>, which will appear across the top
 of your channel to give it a unique look. You can also set a <u>video</u>
 <u>watermark</u> that will appear on your videos and encourage viewers
 to subscribe to your channel.

On the YouTube app, you can change branding elements like profile picture and banner image by selecting **Your channel**, then **Edit channel**.








Upload your video

If you already have videos, learn how to upload them here. If not, the <u>next section</u> will show you how to create one.

- From the YouTube desktop site or app, select your profile picture in the upper-right corner, then select Your channel.
- On the desktop, select <u>Upload video</u> in the center of the screen.
 If you're using the YouTube app, select the + at the bottom of your screen. Then choose the video you want to upload.
- Write a <u>title and brief description</u> that will attract the kind of viewers you're looking for.
- Select a thumbnail for your video. A thumbnail is an image that will appear when people are browsing your channel. Once your video is live, you can also upload or change a thumbnail using the YouTube Studio desktop site or mobile app.

On the YouTube app, select the + at the bottom of your screen to upload your video.








Add advanced elements

<u>Searchable tags</u> are descriptive keywords you can add to your videos that help viewers find your content more easily.

- Add tags while you're uploading your video on the YouTube desktop site under Show more at the bottom.
- Tags can also be added after your video is uploaded. On desktop, go
 to <u>YouTube Studio</u> and then **Content** on the left, selecting the pencil
 icon next to the video you want to edit. Then select **Show more** at
 the bottom. Scroll down to the **Tags section**.
- You can find these options on the YouTube app by selecting Your channel, then Manage videos. Find the video you want to add tags to and select Edit. Scroll down to the bottom to Add tags.

On the YouTube app, add tags after you've uploaded your video. Go to the **Videos** tab, tap your video, then tap **Edit**.








Add more advanced elements

<u>End screens</u> can be used to promote other videos, encourage viewers to subscribe, and more. <u>Video cards</u> can be used to make your videos more interactive. They can feature a video, playlist, channel, or link that you want to direct your viewers to.

- To add these elements, visit <u>YouTube Studio</u> and select **Content** on the right.
- Select the pencil icon next to the video you want to edit. Then select End screens or Cards on the bottom right.

End screens and video cards can be added to your videos on the YouTube desktop site by visiting YouTube Studio.







See how your YouTube channel is performing

After your video goes live, keeping an eye on key metrics will help you know what's working and how to improve. You can find these under **Analytics** in <u>YouTube Studio</u> on your computer or phone.

Overview

- Views: The number of people who play a video
- Watch time (hours): How long people spend watching a video
- Subscribers: How many people subscribed to your channel

Reach

- Impressions: The number of times your video has been shown to viewers
- Traffic sources: How viewers came to find your content

Engagement

- Top videos and playlists: Videos and playlists with the most watch time over the last 28 days
- Top cards and end screens: Your top-performing cards and end screens over the last 28 days

You can find your metrics under **Analytics** in YouTube Studio on your computer or phone.









Learn how to make your video creative great, get tips for filming with a phone, and discover resources that can help you put it all together.



Filming thought starters

When you're starting to think about making videos, there are a few things you should ask yourself:

- What sort of content would you want to watch?
- Who do you want to feature in your video?
- What's the story you want to tell?
- How can you best capture the sights and sounds of your business offering for your video?
- Once you've shot everything, how will you edit it all together to tell your story?





You can upload your completed video to your YouTube channel from your phone.

Tips for filming with your phone

- Be sure to position your subject in the middle of the frame.
- Consider using a lighting source, such as a ring light or desk lamp.
- Use a phone tripod to improve video stability and quality.
- Choose a background that is visually appealing but not distracting.
- Make sure you have enough space on your phone – one minute of 4K video will need about 50 MB.

Attract

Use tight framing on the subject.

Aim for 2–3 shots in the first 5 seconds.

If people appear in your video, open with them on-screen.

Use stunning, delightful, or otherwise memorable imagery.



Brand

Introduce your brand or product in the first 5 seconds.

Optimize logo placement for your marketing objective.

Show visuals like mascots and colors that are unique to your brand.

Use on-screen actors for brand audio mentions.



Connect

Treat function and emotion as levers that can work together or independently.

Don't shy away from functional storytelling.

Lean into emotions like action, humor, and intrigue when it works for your brand.

Make people core to the story.



Direct

Show offers and calls to action (CTAs) through text cards, simple animation, or voice-over.


Make offers inspire a sense of urgency.

Use specific CTAs like Visit site, Sign up, or Buy now, or include a search bar.



Connect with your audience in real time

Whether you're launching a product, teaching a class, or hosting a Q&A, <u>live streaming on YouTube</u> is a great way to interact directly with your audience.

You can <u>stream</u> from your phone, your computer's camera, or by mirroring your screen using an encoder. A webcam is a great option for beginners, and allows you to go live without much setup.

Note: You'll need at least 1,000 subscribers if you want to live stream from your phone.






Here's how to live stream on YouTube

- Make sure your YouTube account is <u>verified</u> by linking your phone number before you access live stream on YouTube.
- On the desktop and mobile sites, navigate to <u>YouTube Studio</u>.
 Select **Create** in the top right, and then **Go live**. On the YouTube app, click your profile picture, select **Your channel**, press the + at the bottom of the screen, and then select **Go live**.
- Follow the prompts to enable your account to use live stream on YouTube.
- You'll be able to instantly live stream from the Go live button once your account is set up.

Set up and launch your campaign


