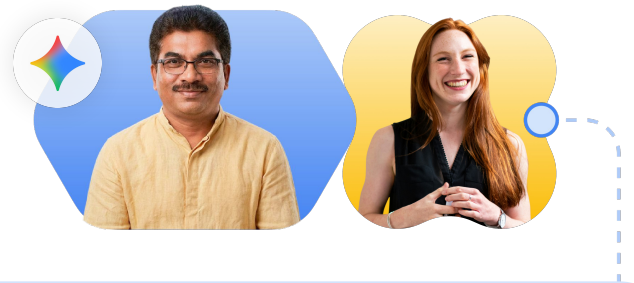

Program Overview

The Google AI Educator Series content goes beyond simply exploring how to use AI tools, and instead is built around the skills educators and students need to be “AI Ready” — aligning to [ISTE+ASCD Standards for Educators](#) and [ISTE+ASCD Standards for Faculty](#), and supporting ISTE+ASCD’s [Profile of an AI-Ready Graduate](#). It is designed to teach core AI concepts, critical thinking skills, and responsible use through hands-on experience with Google tools like Gemini and Gemini Notebook.

Format

Session content is provided in two different formats to allow for flexibility:

- Google Slide decks for in-person training
- Online for self-serve training

At the end of each session, learners are prompted to take a quick assessment to validate their understanding and receive a badge.

The sessions are non-sequential and intended to fit into an educator’s schedule. Sessions will span from 10-15 minutes for K-12, and 30-45 minutes for Higher Education from start to certification.

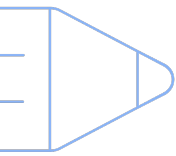
